The Tampa Bay Symphony was founded in 1986 as a non-profit, tax-exempt corporation. Our 90 musicians, of all ages, come from many walks of life: teachers, lawyers, doctors, engineers, housewives,, students and, of course, retirees. All are volunteers, and they attend regular rehearsals for the love of music.

Twenty-four years ago the Tampa Bay Symphony was the first in the area to sponsor a competition for young artists. The winners receive scholarships and an opportunity to perform with the orchestra. The winner of our first competition is now a professor of music at a major university.

Students of all ages in the greater Tampa Bay area are offered discounted tickets to all performances.

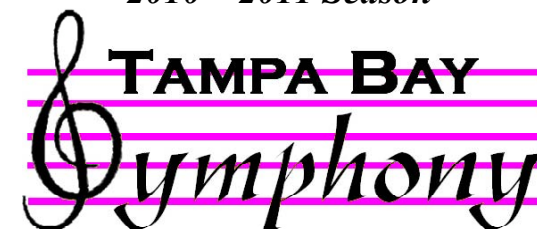

Music Director**

Jack Heller is Professor of Music Emeritus at the University of South Florida, Tampa. He received his undergraduate training at the Juilliard School of Music, Master's degree from the University of Michigan and Ph D. from the University of Iowa. He has held postdoctoral fellowships at Ohio State University and Yale University.

Dr. Heller has been concertmaster of symphony and chamber music groups, and has made numerous recital and solo appearances with orchestras across the United States. His conducting experience includes Music Director of the University of Connecticut Orchestra (1960-66), Music Director of the Manchester (CT) Symphony Orchestra and Chorale (1968-85), and Music Director of the Nutmeg Chamber Orchestra (1984-86). From 1992 to 2002 he was Music Director for the Spanish Lyric Theatre. He has been invited as guest conductor of various orchestras from New York (the New York City Ballet) to Prague (the Czech Radio Orchestra). In 1986 he was appointed Music Director of the Tampa Bay Symphony.
